## Tips

#### Fun with Sentences

- Practice making sentences in the car (or anywhere) by stretching a sentence. Start by having someone share the who and adding to it by answering questions like doing what, when, where, and why.
- Take a sentence from your child's favorite book and print it on paper. Cut the sentence into words/chunks and have them put it back together the correct way. Repeat with more sentences.
- Get a pair of plain dice (or cube shaped boxes). On one, write some possible "who's" and what they could be doing on the other. Have your child roll the dice and write the new sentence. Have your child try to read you the sentence. You might get some LOL type answers. (i.e. The pirate played Minecraft.) Too make it more interesting have your child illustrate their sentences.

### Thinking Outside The Box

SIGHT WORD IDEA

- Use Looking for more ideas to help make learning sight words fun?
- Have you tried having your child write the sight word in big rainbow letters and cutting them up to make a puzzle. Try this activity with those words your child struggles with the most. Remember this activity works best if you use one sight word at a time.

### Activity To Try

**Making Words** 

- Make a word slider by using a paper plate, strip of paper, and a marker.
- © On the plate write a 2-letter word ending such as -op, -ip, -it, -at, and -ot. As your child becomes more comfortable with reading, you can create more complex word endings with four or more letters.
  - On the strip of paper, write one consonant or a two-letter blend in each square, taking care to see that it goes with the ending you have picked.
- Have your child say and write the new words.
- Repeat the process to help your child learn new words.
- \*This is a great opportunity for you to discuss rhyming words.\*
