Tips



What are CVC words?

CVC means consonant, vowel, consonant. CVC words are usually easy to sound out in order read and write. For example, hat would be a CVC word. Having your child practicing these words will help them grow with their letter sound knowledge, as well as their reading abilities. You can find more examples on Google, Pinterest, etc.

Ideas to help your child practice CVC words

-  Sounding them out as they read.
-  Writing the beginning or ending sound. Enhance by writing the whole word.



Thinking Outside The Box CVC Activities

-  Looking for more ideas to work with your child on CVC words?
-  You can use some of the same games/ideas for CVC that you use with your sight words (i.e. hunting for -at ending words, roll the dice and read the word, fly swat slapping and reading the words, find the word in the room and read it)
