Fun with Rhyme

- Practice with rhyming words by making up funny songs in the car (i.e. I know a cat who sat on a?—mat eating some food. He likes fish from a?—dish).
- Read nursery rhymes and listen for rhyming words. Come up with words that rhyme with the words in the poem. List them.
- Play memory using rhyming word flash cards.
- Read Dr. Seuss books like Hop on Pop. List and illustrate the rhyming words.
