- ★ Comparing and ordering numbers 1-20

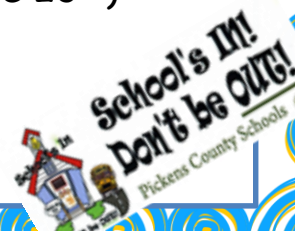

Tips

Addition Ideas

- ✎ Use 2 or 3 dice to help your children add by counting the dots (i.e. 2, 3-2 and 3 make 5).
- ✎ Shake up some items! Put several pieces of two different items in a bowl/cup (i.e. 4 pennies and 3 nickels).
- ✎ Divide a page and put items with a number on each side. Have your child add them together and share/write their number sentence.



Thinking Outside The Box

Save Your Plastic Easter Eggs

- ✎ Make adding fun by having your child match an addition problem "top" to the answer "bottom".
- ✎ You can make this more challenging by writing addition problems up to having the answer of 15 or 20 instead of 5 or 10.



Activity To Try

Adding with Beads

- 😊 Have fun adding by making beaded pipe cleaners to help your child count with as they solve an addition problem. *These can be used later when doing subtraction.*
- 😊 Numeral cards/addition sign/equal sign are important to have as it helps give your child a visual.
