Tips

Sentence Writing

- Mave your child choose a picture from a magazine (i.e. a dog, car, toy). Ask your child to tell you what they see. (i.e. "I see a dog." or "I like dogs.")
- Help your child write their sentence by saying: i.e. what letter says Iwrite it, finger space, the next word is see-what letter does the word see start with-write it, what letter do you hear next-write it, finger space, and so on...
- Remember to ask your child what end mark goes at the end of their sentence. Feel free to use prompts (i.e. Does your sentence make a statement? Ask a question?)
