Tips

Shape Knowledge

- Make something out several different shapes (i.e. square, triangle, circle, oval, rectangle) and sizes of shapes. Use different colors/patters to enhance the activity.
- Sort shapes by having a bowl for each shape. Have a picture example taped to the bowl to help your child match them. To advance this activity, use the shape name instead of a picture.
- Look for shapes in items as you are driving, shopping, etc.

Thinking Outside The Box

SQUISHING SIGHT WORDS

Practicing sight words can get to be a bit of a bore when you just repeat them each day. Have you tried squishing them...

- Make baked cotton ball by mixing equal parts of flour and water (i.e. 2 C of flour and 2 C of water). You can choose to add food coloring to make it more personal.
- Dip the cotton balls in and place them on a cookie sheet.

 Bake them at 300 degrees for an hour. Once cooled, write the sight words on and have your child smash them if they can say the word.

Activity To Try

- Comparing Numbers Game
 Create a comparing numbers game by using a deck of UNO cards (or make some from index cards) and 3 Solo cups.
- © Label the cups: We're equal, I'm more, and I'm Less.
- Separate the cards into two piles. Flip the cards at the same time. Have your child decide the appropriate cup(s) for the cards.
