## Tips

### Recognizing Letters

- Ask your child to look for a certain letter on a TV show/commercial, in the grocery store, sign/billboard, etc.
- Ask your child to circle or highlight certain letters on their cereal box, newspaper, magazine, etc. You could also have your child cut and glue the same letter on a paper to create an alphabet book.
- Play a game by hiding letters around the room. Your child can earn a point if they can find and name the letter. If not, you can re-hide the letter to give them another chance.
